
Undergraduate Major or Minor

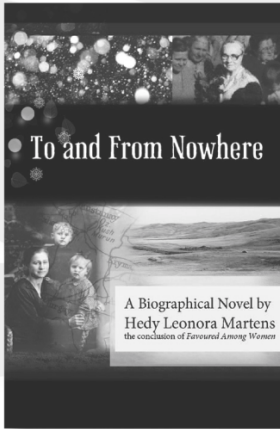

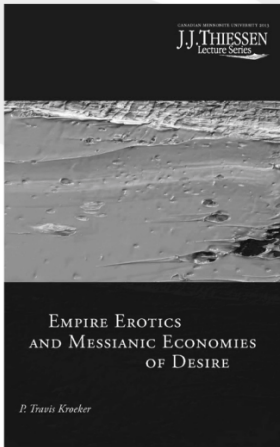
