Edward R. Brandt, Mary Bellingham, Kent Cutkomp, Kermit Frye, and Patricia A. Lowe, *Germanic Genealogy: A Guide to Worldwide Sources and Migration Patterns* (St. Paul, MN: The Germanic Genealogy Society, 1997). Second Edition. 517 pp.

This 8.5" by 11" tomb is a broadly based resource for genealogical research. It is structured as a "how-to" book, introducing the novice to the business of researching ancestors of Germanic background and providing a wealth of related information in the process. This includes a history of German-speaking people in Europe, of religious movements and migrations, of the demography of German-speaking Jews, and many useful addresses and tips on obtaining information. Users will find this a mine of useful data, with a section on "Computers and Genealogy," as well as one on the deciphering of German script. Hundreds of addresses are part of the package. This volume should be in every serious genealogy library.
