

#### The University of Winnipeg Chair in Mennonite Studies

The University of Winnipeg invites applications for an endowed Chair in Mennonite Studies. Endowment for the Chair is provided by grants from the Dr. David Friesen Family Foundation Corporation and the Department of the Secretary of State of Canada.

The University of Winnipeg is a primarily undergraduate liberal arts and sciences institution which places a high value on teaching, research and scholarship.

The Chair is expected to advance interdisciplinary research in areas encompassing, but not limited to, the social, historical, religious and cultural aspects of the Mennonite community. In addition, the Chair will participate in the editing and publication of The Journal of Mennonite Studies, and will teach undergraduate courses under the heading of "Mennonite Studies."

For administrative purposes, the Chair will be housed in an academic department that is appropriate to his or her scholarly background. The appointment will be made at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications. The appointment will be made for an initial term of five years: following a satisfactory evaluation against the stated objectives of the Chair, the appointment may be extended for an indefinite term, equivalent to tenure.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. The University of Winnipeg is committed to the principle of employment equity. In accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, first preference must be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada.

Applicants are requested to submit a curriculum vitae, the names and addresses of three referees, a brief outline of their teaching and research interests, and their ideas concerning the relationship of the Chair to the community. The deadline for receipt of applications and nominations is March 15, 1996. Subject to budgetary approval, the appointment will be made effective on July 1, 1996.
